Minutes of Regular Meeting

A Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Alpine ISD was held Wednesday, January 19, 2022, beginning at 5:00 PM in the Alpine High School Library.

I. Call Meeting to Order

Board President Eddie Natera called the meeting to order at 5:03 p.m.

VII. Public Hearing to Discuss Alpine ISD's Rating on Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR) (Goal 1)

Board President Eddie Natera, adjuourned the regular meeting and called the Public Hearing to order at 5:08 p.m. to discuss Alpine ISD's rating on the Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR).

Campus principals reviewed data and statistics included in the TAPR reports. Information includes assessment scores, comparisons with state averages, scores for special populations, and, at the high school level, drop out rates, college readiness, and graduation tracts. Accountability ratings were not provided, as TEA declared a State of Disaster for 2021 and did not release accountaability ratings.

Mr. McEntire commended the principals and campuses for the jobs being done, excelling through all the trials faced by administrators, teachers, staff, and students. He said Alpine ISD is maintaining rigor, while still working through the adversities.

X. Reconvene Open Meeting

Board President Eddie Natera reconvened the regular board meeting in open session at 7:11 p.m.

XI. Construction Updates (Goals 1, 2, 4)

A. Alpine ISD

Ms. McCutchen updated board members on the status of the gym floor, indicating that progress is pending a decision from the insurance companies. Inspections of the gym walls are being conducted to see if there is water damage to the walls. Cleaning crews have been working on the Ag Shop and Welding Shop with a target move in date of 1/29/2022. The target date for the academic building is 6/18 - 6/29/2022. Mr. McEntire discussed issues with the floors in the CTE rooms. Said it will be replaced at the builders expense.

B. Imperial Construction

Jon Jones reviewd the three week look-ahead, reviewing progress and issues. He explained that they have been encountering crew problems due to COVID, and have been attempting to employ temporary help with utilizing local laborers. Mr. Jones also reported they have been encountering material supply issues. Work continues on duct socks at Middle School and Elementary gyms.

C. Parkhill

Les Burke discussed corrections to roofing issues and said he has been working through the problems with Greg Carroll. Working on signage meetings and final subittals.

XII. Review and Consideration of Furnishings Plan and Pricing for AHS Bond Project (Goals 1, 2, 4)

Conrad Arriola reviewed the changes made to the proposal. He said that implemented cuts and valued engineering changes to reduce the overall project from \$848,000 to \$940.186.97.

A motion was made by Mary McCallister, seconded by Justin Cross, to approve the furnishings plan and pricing package at a cost of \$697,940.18, with an adjustment for the purchase of desks for the robotics classroom, and excluding purchase of new music stands.

The additional leave days will be made available beginning on January 20, 2022, and will be available through the end of the 2021-2022 school year. The additional days will only be available going forward and will not be retroactive for prior absences.

A. Enrollment Report

Enrollment Report

Total enrollment stands at 970, with an ADA of 94.37 %.

Enrollment for the campuses is:

Alpine High School: 309 enrollment; ADA of 96.09 %. Alpine Middle School: 272 enrollment; ADA of 95.14 %. Alpine Elementary School: 389 enrollment; ADA of 92.69 %

B. COVID-19 Update

Mr. McEntire commended the school nurse, Gayla Owen, for the job she is doing. He said Alpine ISD has been working very hard to stay within TEA guidelines. He said administrators have reviewed the Return to School plan, and Ms. Fox is currently working on a document making protocols clearer. He said the document would be posted to the website and circulated as soon as it is complete. He said the revisions would assure consistency with protocols from campus to campus. Mr. McEntire also reviewed changes made to the COVID dashboard. Testing days will be changed to only two days a week, Tuesday and Thursday, due to a shortage of test kits.

Dr. Billings expressed his appreciation to Ms. Owens for the job she is doing as school nurse. He said she is in a very difficult position, trying to assimilate school processes with health guidelines and concerns.
